We manage BARL professionally, achieving year after year the highest level of charity ratings with GuideStar/Candid and Charity Navigator.

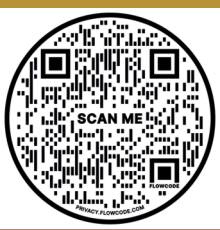

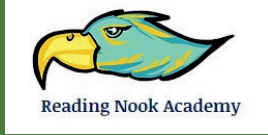
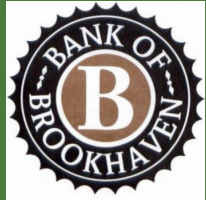
